Practice Position on – the New Mexico Medical Cannabis Program

Regarding the New Mexico Medical Cannabis Program, our physicians are available to assist you in documenting the degree and cause of your chronic pain as well as provide sponsorship as one of the two physician sponsors required by the state. This will involve an initial office visit and electrodiagnostic testing, such as EMG. Additional testing, including x-rays, CT, MRI, Bone Scan, may then be ordered to update any prior studies that are more than 6-12 months old.

Once testing is complete, you will meet with the doctor, who will go over your results and let you know if our evaluation was able to document the source of your pain and whether we will be able to function as one of your sponsors.

You will then be provided with copies of our reports, that you will give your other Physician sponsor, who may then use them in support of your petition for approval to the New Mexico Medical Cannabis Program.
